Oregon Onsite Wastewater Association Scholarship Program Application Form

The purpose of this scholarship program is to:

- 1. Promote the education of members of the Oregon Onsite Wastewater Association (O2WA) and their sons or daughters in any field of higher education, and
- 2. Promote education in the environmental sciences or other related academic pursuits that apply to the field of onsite wastewater treatment.

Forty (40) percent of the weight in scoring applications provides an incentive toward fields of study related to the onsite industry.

A. Eligibility

Candidates must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a child or dependent, age 25 or less, of a current O2WA Member (Individual or listed Corporate Member) in good standing as of May 31 of the preceding year planning to study or currently studying in any field of higher education. A child or dependent is defined as a son or daughter (including step-children) living in the members household or primarily supported by the member; or
- 2. Be a non-O2WA member interested in pursuing an education beyond high school through study in fields related to onsite wastewater treatment. Students are limited to relevant fields of study that apply to the field of onsite wastewater treatment, including, but are not limited to, public health, environmental science, soil science, engineering, construction technology, or biology.

Candidates must:

- 1. Be a high school senior or graduate who plans to enroll as a full-time student or is already enrolled as a full-time student in a technical or undergraduate field of study at an accredited vocational school, two-year college or four-year college or university; and
- 2. Complete and submit the scholarship application and all required attachments by the stated deadline. Candidates need not be Oregon residents or attend Oregon schools.

Further, O2WA pledges not to discriminate on the basis of race, color, age, sex, marital or veteran status, creed, religion, or disability.

When to Apply

All application materials must be postmarked no later than April 30th. Recipients will be notified if they were a successful recipient and the amount of their award.

How is the Scholarship Awarded

O2WA will make payments directly to the student following submission of proof of registration and attendance by an appropriate faculty member for the current academic period. Payments will be made on an academic quarter, term, or semester basis. For example, payment during the second quarter will depend upon successful completion of the first quarter. For any academic year, the successful applicant will need to tell us how many terms, quarters, or semesters will be in his or her academic year.

Letters should be written on the author's letterhead, where relevant and signed.

Do not forget to enclose a minimum of three references as noted in the Scholarship Framework and above. You may submit more than three, as long as the criteria for basic submission are met.

This scholarship is a merit-based program. Decisions of the O2WA in this matter or any other scholarship issue will be considered final.

By signing this application below, the applicant certifies that the information provided in this application form and any attachments is true. The applicant agrees that if the applicant is selected to receive a scholarship, the applicant will attend the institution listed above and will pursue the major course of study listed in this application for the duration of the academic year.
